## EA wins four awards from ASEAN and Thailand energy platforms

Energy Absolute Public Company Limited (EA) has reaffirmed its position as one of Thailand's leading innovative energy providers after it snatched up four awards, including First Runner-up for Renewal Energy in the Biofuel Project Category, at the ASEAN Energy Awards 2021 hosted by ASEAN Centre for Energy.

The ASEAN Centre for Energy was originally set up by the Palm Oil Refining and Biodiesel Plant Project at Prachin Buri Province with the purpose to provide support for palm oil farmers to expand the domestic palm oil market. The organisation also implemented new technologies to extract biodiesel from the crude palm oil – with production capacity reaching 800,000 litres per day, more than 188 million litres per annum, while at the same slashing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by the equivalent of 120,708,369.56 million tonnes of carbon dioxide each year.



In addition, Energy Absolute Public Company Limited (EA) won three other accolades for Outstanding Renewal Energy and Energy Conservation at Thailand Energy Awards 2021 – hosted by Department of Alternative Energy Development and Efficiency (DEDE) and the Ministry of Energy – including the Outstanding Award in Renewal Energy, On-Grid Renewable Energy Project Category; Outstanding Award in Renewal Energy, Biofuel Project Category and the Outstanding Award for Energy Conservation in the Transportation Category.
